In this season of Easter, we are reminded of the new life that the resurrection brings. We are completely changed by Jesus being raised from the dead for our new life, and world history

is completely altered by this historical event for believer and unbeliever alike. Jesus rose, and everything changes! Praise God!

Hebrew 13:20-21 says,
